

Answers to most frequently asked questions

At what age can my child start?

We offer an adult/child class for children at 18 months of age. Those who are ready to leave the guiding hand of an adult can begin dance classes independently at age 2. In order to enroll in Pre-Ballet, students must be age 3 and potty-trained. We offer enrollment opportunities in September, January and June.

Can parents stay and observe?

Visitors are permitted in our classroom on designated days only. However, we do have an open door policy and encourage parents to drop in on class in action at anytime. These observations must be done from the area outside of the classroom.

What should my child wear?

Uniforms are required in all classes, to promote an educational and professional setting. Students are also required to have one pair of shoes for each style of dance. Before making a purchase, be sure to review our student uniform policy information and your class requirements.

How long are the classes and when do they meet?

All classes meet once a week. Petite Feet classes are 35 minutes and Pre-Ballet classes are 45 minutes in length. All other Children's Dance classes are 1 hour in length. Classes for children over age 8 vary from 1 hour to 2 hours each week.

Is there a recital?

Yes. Since dance is a performance art, a recital is encouraged as a year-end display of your child's talent, but is not mandatory. Our Petite Feet and Pre-Ballet classes do not participate in the annual recital. There are additional fees associated with the recital.

Make up classes are encouraged. A student's place is reserved in class whether they attend or not, therefore no refunds for missed classes will be given. Make up schedules are distributed on October 1st each year.

How do I register?
